The poster exhibits will highlight key artifacts that tell the rich and diverse story of the African American experience from child-size shackles of a slave to the track shoes worn by Olympian Carl Lewis.

In addition, there will be a poster exhibit of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s daring vision for economic justice and opportunity for every U.S. citizen, a living history that reflects challenge, triumph, faith and hope.

Furthermore, there will be a poster exhibit designed for young people that will encourage dialogue, engagement, respect, and participation as our world has become more interconnected. It is more important than ever to inspire people of all ages to create positive social change.
